- ❖ In the 1st Ney Darsal Tsogspa Archery Competition, our team comprising of Stanzin Chosgyal from Class 7th, and Sonam Gyatso, Rigzen Dorjay and Pasta Chospal from Class 9th, won the Upcoming Team trophy and the Youngest player of Tournament award.
